#### From the Pastor's Desk - Dear Friends,

I hope you're all doing well. As I noted in an earlier bulletin, I will be away from Sept. 8-24. The Fall Fair at Saint Patrick's was a huge success! A heartfelt thank you to the coordinators, volunteers, and everyone whose support made it possible. Let's continue to strengthen our parish family with our prayers, presence, and generosity.

The CWL is meeting at St. Patrick's on Wed., Sept. 10. I want to encourage women from the three parishes to attend as there will be discussion re the future direction of CWL in our Margaree family.

This week, the steps in front of St. Michael's Church will be repaired. Thanks to the generous donation of a parishioner from St. Michael's, the expense will be fully covered.

Let us also remember in our prayers the children who have returned to school and are beginning a new year. Please consider registering your children for First Communion and Confirmation. Grandparents, with prayer and the help of the Holy Spirit, make every effort to encourage baptism for your grandchildren. *Let the children come to the Lord*. A heart filled with faith is far better than an empty one. May the Lord bless our children and fill them with His love and mercy.

The Gospel today is one of the most challenging sayings of Jesus. He tells the crowd: "Whoever does not carry his cross and follow me cannot be my disciple." These words remind us that discipleship is not simply about belonging to a group or saying we believe in Jesus, it is about a radical choice.

In the first reading from the Book of Wisdom, we are reminded how limited human reasoning can be. "Who can know God's counsel? Or who can conceive what the Lord intends?" Left to ourselves, we struggle to see clearly. But God, through His Spirit, guides us in the way of truth. Following Christ requires trust, because on our own we cannot fully grasp the mystery of God's plan.

The second reading, from St. Paul's letter to Philemon, gives us a living example of discipleship. Paul asks Philemon to receive back Onesimus, a runaway slave, not as property but as a brother in Christ. This is a radical request—one that would have shocked the social order of the time. Yet Paul shows that discipleship means letting go of pride, power, and control, and allowing Christ to transform relationships.

And then, in the Gospel, Jesus asks us to "calculate the cost" of discipleship. He gives the image of someone building a tower or a king going into battle, you do not start unless you are willing to finish. To follow Christ is to place Him above every other attachment, even family, possessions, and personal comfort.

But let's be clear: Jesus is not telling us to despise our families or to abandon responsibility. He is telling us that love for Him must come first, and that when He is at the center, we actually love our families more deeply and more faithfully. Without Christ, our loves are fragile; with Him, our loves become life-giving.

So what does this mean for us?

- It means asking ourselves: What cross do I carry for Christ? Is it forgiving someone who hurt me? Is it giving time for prayer when life is busy? Is it guiding my children and grandchildren in faith when the world offers distractions?
- It means realizing that discipleship is not just Sunday worship it is a daily choice, a daily "yes" to Christ.
- It means we don't walk alone. Just as Paul encouraged Philemon, we encourage one another in faith, building a community where love and mercy are stronger than fear and division.

Let us pray today for the courage to take up our cross with trust. The path of discipleship is demanding, but it leads to freedom, peace, and eternal life. May we not settle for half-built towers, but, with the grace of God, become true disciples of Jesus.


