From the Pastor's Desk - Brothers and sisters in Christ,

We are already in the fall season, and here in Margaree the hills and valleys are painted in beautiful colours—gold, orange, red, green and brown. Nature reminds us that every season has its own beauty, and autumn in a special way shows us God's artistry. Just as the trees are clothed in many colours, this month of October is also meant to be colourful in our spiritual lives. It is the Month of the Holy Rosary, when the Church invites us to take up this prayer with fresh devotion.

The rosary itself is like a garden of colours. Each set of mysteries—the Joyful, Luminous, Sorrowful, and Glorious—adds a shade to our prayer life. Together they form a spiritual landscape as beautiful as our fall hills. When we pray the rosary, we are not simply repeating words, but meditating on the colours of Christ's life—from the bright joy of Bethlehem, to the dark sorrow of Calvary, to the radiant glory of the Resurrection.

October also calls us to let the rosary colour our own lives with the virtues of Jesus and Mary. The Joyful mysteries teach us gratitude and humility, the Luminous mysteries help us see the light of Christ in our daily life, the Sorrowful mysteries give us strength in suffering, and the Glorious mysteries fill us with hope.

The rosary is a prayer of peace and protection. History reminds us of its power: from the victory at Lepanto in 1571, when Christians prayed the rosary for deliverance, to the call of Our Lady at Fatima in 1917, asking us to pray for peace in the world. And closer to home, how many of us have reached for the rosary during times of sickness, grief, or worry, and found in it a strength that carried us through?

In this beautiful season of autumn, as the leaves fall and the air grows crisp, let us take the rosary in our hands. Let it be our way of thanking God for the colours of creation, and of colouring our hearts with the presence of Christ.

This October, I invite you:

- Pray the rosary in your families, so that faith may remain strong in your homes.
- Pray for peace in our world, especially where there is war and violence.
- Pray for our parish, that we may grow in holiness and unity.

Brothers and sisters, the rosary is like a path through a colourful forest. Every bead is a step with Mary, leading us closer to Jesus. Let us walk that path this October, and let our lives shine with the colours of faith, hope, and love.


