From the Pastor's Desk - My dear people in Christ,

Fall is beautiful with all the colours in Margaree. The hills and valleys are dressed in gold, red, and orange, and I see many visitors who come here to behold this scenic beauty. We are truly blessed to live in such a place where nature itself seems to lift its voice in praise of God. The changing of the seasons reminds us of God's constant presence and the many blessings we often take for granted.

Today's Gospel also speaks about blessings and gratitude. Jesus heals ten lepers, but only one, a Samaritan, comes back to thank him. The other nine are healed, but they forget to return. This story is not just about healing; it's about recognizing and responding to God's grace with a thankful heart.

1. God's blessings are abundant but often unnoticed. Naaman in the first reading was a great commander, yet he suffered from leprosy. When the prophet Elisha told him to wash in the Jordan, he almost refused because it seemed too simple. But once he humbled himself, healing came and with it, faith. He returned to Elisha full of gratitude, saying, "Now I know there is no God in all the earth except in Israel."

Sometimes God's blessings come in simple, ordinary ways through people, daily routines, or even small sacrifices. But like Naaman and the ten lepers, we can easily overlook them if our hearts are proud or distracted.

2. Gratitude completes the miracle. All ten lepers were healed, but only one was *saved*. Jesus says to the thankful Samaritan, "Your faith has made you well." Healing of the body is good; healing of the heart is greater. Gratitude opens our hearts to deeper faith, to a relationship that goes beyond receiving gifts to knowing and loving the Giver.

The ungrateful nine missed that second miracle the miracle of a transformed heart. Gratitude, then, is not just politeness; it is a form of worship. It keeps us aware of God's presence and keeps our faith alive.

3. Living gratitude and faith in the face of suffering. In the second reading, St. Paul writes from prison, "Remember Jesus Christ, raised from the dead." Even in hardship, Paul remembers, gives thanks, and remains faithful. Gratitude and faith go together. When we truly believe that Jesus is risen and with us, even suffering cannot steal our hope.

As we reflect on these words, let us also remember our brothers and sisters who suffer for their faith. In Nigeria alone, nearly **125,000 Christians have lost their lives in recent years** at the hands of violent Islamic extremists. They, too, hold onto faith in the midst of great trials.

Let us take up the **rosary** this month of October the month dedicated to Our Lady and pray for peace, justice, and protection for all persecuted Christians, especially in Nigeria, Pakistan, Bangladesh, India and Middle Eastern countries. May Our Blessed Mother wrap them in her mantle and bring comfort to those who grieve

As we move through this beautiful autumn season, let's take a moment each day to notice the gifts around us the colours of the trees, the smile of a neighbour, the gift of health, the food on our table, and the people who love us. Every one of these is a sign that God is near.

Let's not be among the nine who forget to thank God. Let's be like the Samaritan who came back, knelt before Jesus, and praised God with a full heart.

May this Eucharist which literally means *thanksgiving* deepen our awareness of God's mercy and strengthen our hearts to live in continual gratitude and faith.

"Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good; his love endures forever." (Psalm 136:1)

1. Prayer for Persecuted Christians

Lord Jesus Christ, You carried the cross for our salvation and taught us to love even in the face of suffering. We lift up to You our brothers and sisters in Nigeria and in every land who suffer violence, persecution, and loss because of their faith in You. Strengthen their courage, Lord. Protect their families. Console those who mourn, and bring peace to their hearts. May their steadfast faith be a light to the world and a reminder of Your victory over darkness and death. Through the intercession of Our Blessed Mother, may peace and justice flourish where hatred now reigns. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.


