Memorial: none this week

From the Pastor's Desk - My dear people in Christ,

We all have our hilltop moments, moments when we feel the weight of prayer, responsibility, or suffering pressing down on us. Like Moses in the first reading, we begin our battles with courage and hope, but as the ours and days pass, our arms grow heavy, our enthusiasm weakens, and our faith begins to tire. There are times when we pray fervently but hear no answer...times when we try to do what's right, yet face opposition or loneliness...times when we simply feel too weary to keep going.

These are the moments when our hands fall when the battle seems too long and our faith too small, but the Word of God today reminds us that we are not meant to stand alone on that hill. Even Moses the great leader, the man of God could not hold up his hands by himself. He needed Aaron and Hur beside him. They didn't fight the battle for him, but they supported him so that he could keep praying, keep believing, and keep standing firm.

This is what faith looks like in real life not perfect strength, but shared perseverance. We all need our Aarons and Hurs, people who lift us up when our spirits are low, who pray for us when we can't pray, who remind us that we are not alone, and at the same time, God calls us to be that support for someone else, to notice the tired arms around us, to offer encouragement, to quietly hold up another person's faith when it starts to fall.

The responsorial psalm today gives voice to this truth: "Our help is from the Lord, who made heaven and earth." The psalmist lifts his eyes to the mountains and asks, "From where shall my help come?" It's the question that rises from every human heart in moments of fear, weakness, or uncertainty, and the answer comes with calm conviction: "My help is from the Lord, who made heaven and earth."

Our help does not come from human power, from wealth, or from clever solutions. It comes from the Lord, the Creator of all things, who never sleeps, never tires, and never forgets us. But to live this truth is not easy. It's one thing to say that our help comes from the Lord — it's another thing to trust it when life feels dark, when prayers seem unanswered, and when hope begins to fade.

That's why the Gospel today fits so perfectly. Jesus tells the parable of the persistent widow — a woman who keeps returning to an unjust judge, day after day, asking for justice. She doesn't give up. She doesn't lose heart. Eventually, even the unjust judge gives in, not because he's righteous, but because she refuses to stop asking. And Jesus tells this story, Luke says, "to teach us the need to pray always and not lose heart." God is not like the unjust judge. He is good, merciful, and attentive. But Jesus knows that we need persistence in prayer, because prayer is not about wearing God down; it's about staying close to Him, especially when we don't see results. Every time we pray, even in dryness, we are saying, "Lord, I still trust You. My help is from You."

The widow's perseverance mirrors Moses' faith on the mountain — both kept going when they were tired. Both refused to give up. Both discovered that strength comes not from themselves, but from God.

So, dear friends, the message today is both comforting and challenging:

- When your faith grows weary, remember that your help is from the Lord.
- When you see someone struggling, be their Aaron or Hur lift them up.
- And when God seems silent, be like the persistent widow keep praying, keep trusting, keep knocking.

Faith is not measured by how easily we receive answers, but by how faithfully we keep praying when we don't. It's not about never getting tired — it's about finding strength in the Lord when we do.

When you face your next "hilltop moment" — when your hands grow weary or your heart grows faint — lift your eyes and whisper the truth of today's psalm, "Our help is from the Lord, who made heaven and earth."

And if you see someone beside you whose hands are trembling — lift them up because when we hold one another in faith, God holds all of us in His strength.


