From the Pastor's Desk - Greetings of peace and joy in the name of Jesus Christ,

This Sunday's readings remind us that God sees the heart, not appearances. In the Gospel, the Pharisee stands tall and lists all his good deeds, while the tax collector simply bows his head and prays, "O God, be merciful to me, a sinner." Jesus tells us that it was the humble tax collector not the proud Pharisee who went home right with God.

Our world today often rewards self-promotion, image, and success. We post our achievements, compare ourselves with others, and sometimes even measure our worth by how we appear. But God's measure is different. What matters to Him is honesty, humility, and the courage to admit our need for His mercy.

In the second reading, St. Paul looks back on his life with gratitude, saying, "I have fought the good fight. I have kept the faith." His confidence isn't in his own strength, but in the Lord who stood by him and gave him courage. That same grace is offered to us especially when we feel tired, unnoticed, or alone.

The Book of Sirach reminds us that, "The prayer of the lowly pierces the clouds." God always hears the cry of the humble heart. True holiness is not about being perfect, but about being real before God, acknowledging that everything good in us comes from Him.

As we come before the Lord this week, let's make the prayer of the tax collector our own, "Lord, have mercy on me, a sinner." In that humble prayer, we find peace, healing, and the joy of knowing that God's love is greater than our failings.


